





Nurses Corner

Flu season is upon us. This then means so is "vaccination time". What is the flu? Flu is an abbreviation for Influenza, this is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death.



There are many different strains. Each year the vaccine changes based on international surveillance and scientists' estimations about which types and strains of viruses will circulate in a given year. It is the best "educated guess" that science can make to help prevent this illness. Why vaccinate? To reduce their chances of getting the flu. Students are in close proximity of other classmates and this closeness can increase the risk of spreading any illness. Vaccination can help reduce their risk of contracting this.


There are several vaccines required of children who attend school. Two of the most common ones that may be brought to your attention in the Middle School are the boosters that students need after age 11. These are TDap Booster and the MCV4. TDaP stands for Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertusis.

Tetanus is also called "lockjaw". It can lead to sever muscle spasms and death. Diphtheria is a disease that attacks the throat and heart. In severe cases, it can lead to heart failure and death. Pertusis (whooping cough) causes severe coughing that makes it hard to breath, eat, and drink. It can lead to pneumonia, convulsions, brain damage, and death. The MCV4 vaccine protects against 4 different "strains" of bacterial meningitis caused by the bacteria N. meningitis. Bacterial meningitis is an infection of the fluid around the brain and spinal cord. It is a serious illness that can cause more serious complications, such as brain damage, hearing loss or blindness.



LMS NEWS






